
Session 3

The Death and Resurrection of Jesus



Introduction

Have you ever wondered about Jesus's Death on the Cross? Why was Jesus willing to endure the suffering of his Crucifixion? The answer is love. Jesus loved you so much that he was willing to give everything, even his life, for you. And he wants to continue to share his life and love with you in the Eucharist! In the Eucharist, the sacrifice of lesus on the Cross is made present, when we receive the Body of Christ at Holy Communion. The Eucharist is the most important sacrament because it makes Jesus present to us.

Key Words

Crucified

To put to death by nailing or tying a person to a cross as a form of punishment.

Sabbath

The seventh day of the week, or Saturday. It was the day of worship for the Jewish people.



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From John 19:28-20:10


When Jesus was on the Cross, he said, "I thirst." One of the soldiers soaked a sponge in vinegar and held it up on a stick to offer Jesus. When Jesus drank the vinegar, he said, "It is finished." Then he died.

None of Jesus's bones were broken when he was **crucified**. But to make sure that he had really died, one of the soldiers stuck a spear into his side. When he did this, blood and water flowed out of Jesus's side.

Some of Jesus's friends took his body down from the Cross. They buried him in a new tomb that was nearby. They had to bury him quickly before the Sabbath started.

Very early on Sunday morning, the third day after he died, one of the women who followed Jesus came to the tomb. Her name was Mary Magdalene. When she arrived at the tomb, she saw that the stone covering the opening was removed and the tomb was empty! She ran back to tell Peter and John.

When they heard the news, Peter and John raced to the tomb. When they got there, all they found were the linen cloths that had been wrapped around Jesus's body when he was buried. Jesus was not in his tomb! He had risen from the dead, just as he said he would!



Let's Learn About Our Faith

Called to Be Witnesses

The punishment for sin is death, but Jesus died on the Cross for our **salvation**. Through his Death, Resurrection, and Ascension into Heaven, he saved us from our sins and opened the gates of Heaven so that we can live with him forever.



Jesus was the perfect sacrifice for our sins. In the Passover, the Jews had to sacrifice a male lamb without any defects. And they couldn't break any of the lamb's bones. Then they ate the lamb in the Passover meal.

Jesus is the Son of God, which means that he never sinned. None of his bones were broken when he was crucified. He is the perfect Lamb of God. Because of his great love for us, Jesus offered himself to God the Father as a sacrifice on the Cross, and he gives himself to us as spiritual food in the Eucharist.

After Jesus's Death on the Cross, he was buried in the tomb. But three days later, he rose from the dead. After his **Resurrection**, Jesus taught his disciples for forty days. He promised them that he would send the Holy Spirit. Then he ascended into Heaven to be with the Father. This event is called the **Ascension**.

Jesus kept his promise on the Feast of **Pentecost**. Fifty days after Jesus's Resurrection and ten days after his Ascension, Mary and the Apostles were gathered together in prayer. There was a mighty wind, and tongues like fire rested on them, and they were filled with the Holy Spirit.

They received the strength and courage to be witnesses for Christ. Immediately they went out and started telling everyone the Good News of Jesus Christ. On that day, many people believed and were baptized.

At Baptism, the Holy Spirit makes us members of the Church, the **Body of Christ**. As members of the Body of Christ, we share in Jesus's mission to bring God's love to everyone.

Key Words

Salvation

The forgiveness of our sins and healing of our friendship with God so that we can be united with him now on earth and for all of eternity in Heaven.

Resurrection

Jesus's rising from the dead on the third day after his Death on the Cross. We call this special day Easter!

Ascension

When Jesus went up into Heaven, Body and Soul, forty days after his Resurrection.

Pentecost

The descent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary and the Apostles, which is the beginning of the Catholic Church.

Body of Christ Another name for the Church.


Witnesses

People who tell others the truth about what they have seen and heard. We are called to be witnesses to God's love.

We do this by being faithful followers of Jesus and by being **witnesses** and sharing his message of God's love. The Eucharist strengthens us to carry out the mission of Jesus.

Jesus Is the Lamb of God

Before Holy Communion, the priest takes the Host and breaks it. The people say:

Then the priest raises the Host and says:

Source and Summit

The Church calls the Eucharist the "source and summit" of the life of the Church.

The Eucharist is the most important part of being Catholic.

In the Mass, Jesus's sacrifice on the Cross is made present once again. Jesus only died on the Cross once, but each time we go to Mass his perfect sacrifice on the Cross is made present once again. In the Sacrament of the Eucharist, Jesus strengthens and renews in us this beautiful gift of salvation.

Key Words

Chrism

The blessed oil used for anointing in Baptism and Confirmation. This oil is a sign that we are receiving the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit

The Blessed Trinity is one God in three Persons: the Father,

the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the third Person of the Blessed Trinity. Jesus told his Apostles that when he returned to the Father in Heaven he would send the Holy Spirit to be with them always. The Holy Spirit strengthens us with his gifts. He reminds us of everything Jesus taught us. We receive the Holy Spirit when we are baptized. This makes us temples of the Holy Spirit. At Confirmation we receive a special outpouring of the Holy Spirit, just as the Apostles did at Pentecost, increasing and deepening the grace of our Baptism. In both Baptism and Confirmation, a special oil called chrism is placed on our foreheads, and we are anointed with the Holy Spirit. When the Holy Spirit lives in our hearts, he fills us with Sanctifying Grace. This is the gift of God's own divine life in us to make us holy. The Holy Spirit also gives us Actual Grace, which helps us in each moment to love God and make the right choices.



- 5. Ascension



Story of a Saint



Venerable Antonietta Meo (1930–1937)

Venerable Antonietta Meo could be the youngest saint ever canonized—she lived to be just six years old. She had painful bone cancer at age five and had to have her leg amputated. Even with this suffering, she stayed cheerful. She often wrote letters to Jesus, asking for his grace to bear her pain, wanting to suffer just as he did. She couldn't wait to receive Jesus in Holy Communion so she could be with him here on earth, even as she prepared to be with him in Heaven. Antonietta knew that her mission from God was to offer her suffering for sinners so that they could share in Jesus's Resurrection.


The whole family was silent.
