


## Keep Holy the Lord's Day!

# Things We Learned This Week

1. The Liturgy of the Mass is our public worship and participation in the work of God.
2. The sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross is made present at Mass.
3. The Mass is celebrated on Sunday because that is the day the Lord was raised from the dead. As Christians, we have the gift and obligation to attend Mass every Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation.
4. At Mass, we participate in the one sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross, and in Holy Communion we receive the Body and Blood of Christ.
5. Each Mass is a participation in the heavenly liturgy, where we worship God with all the angels and saints in Heaven.

### The Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians

The Scripture reading for this week’s lesson was from 1 Corinthians 11:23–29. Please take time to read and reflect on this passage as a family.

## Flash Cards

### Key Words – Session 6 (definitions)

The Liturgy which is comprised of the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

The words and actions that we use when we worship God and celebrate the sacraments.

The first part of the Mass in which the Word of God in the readings from Scripture is proclaimed.
