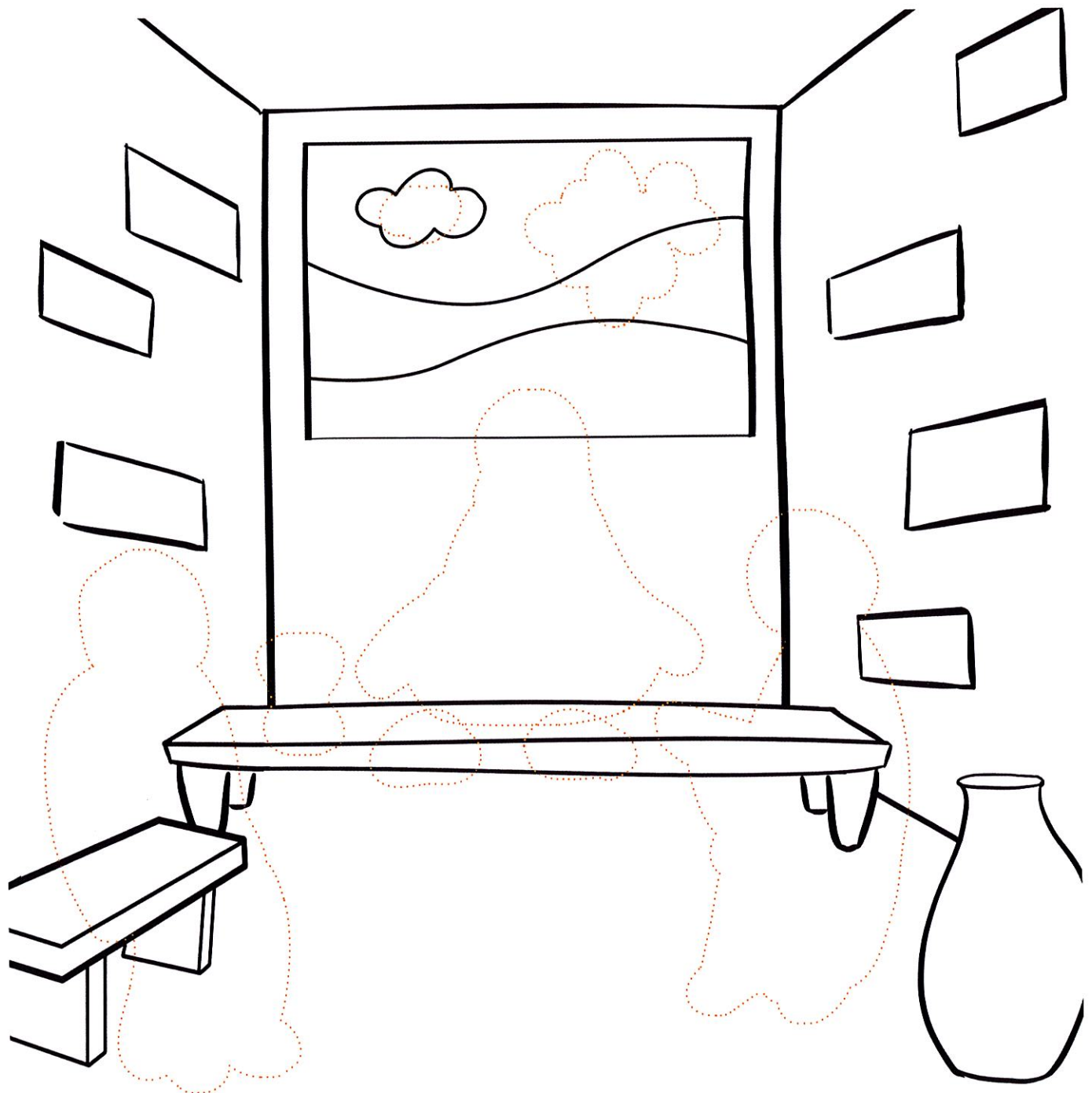

Things We Learned This Week

1. The Mass is one act of worship with two parts: the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.
2. The second part of the Mass is called the Liturgy of the Eucharist, where Jesus becomes present to us, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.
3. Jesus's sacrifice on the Cross and his Resurrection are made present to us, and we also offer our lives as living sacrifices to God.
4. When we receive Holy Communion, we are united with Jesus in a very special way.
5. The Mass sends us forth to spread the Gospel by the witness of our lives.

1. **Just as Jesus's friends truly saw him in the breaking of the bread, he wants us to see him in the Eucharist too! How is the Eucharist the greatest sign of God's love for us and his desire that we will be close to him always?**

The Road to Emmaus – Part 2

The Scripture reading for this week's lesson was from Luke 24:28-35. Please take time to read and reflect on this passage as a family.

Key Words – Session 8 (definitions)

The priest or deacon prepares the altar by placing all the necessary items in their places.

The bread and wine are brought up to the priest.

The center and high point of the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

The prayer the priest prays over the bread and wine after they have been placed on the altar.

The song we all sing in union with the hosts of Heaven: “Holy, holy, holy.”

The first part of the Eucharistic Prayer, in which the priest gives thanks and glory to God.

Key Words – Session 8 (definitions)

The part of the Eucharistic Prayer that tells the story of the Last Supper.

When the priest extends his hands over the bread and wine and asks the Holy Spirit to come down so that they may be changed into the Body and Blood of Christ.

In this prayer we remember the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus, and express our faith that he will come again.

“This is my Body...” and “This is the chalice of my Blood...”

The special plate that holds the Host.

The special cup that holds the wine that will become the Blood of Christ.

Key Words – Session 8 (definitions)

The “amen” that the whole congregation says or sings in response to the Doxology.

The prayer of praise giving glory to God at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer, which the priest prays while elevating the chalice.

The prayer we say or sing together, which begins “Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us...”

We pray the Lord’s Prayer together.

The prayer the priest says after we have all received Holy Communion.

The time when we receive the Body and Blood of our Lord under the appearance of bread and wine.

In the Mass, the priest acts “in the Person of Jesus the Head,” as the representative of Jesus.

The priest gives us a final blessing, and we all make the Sign of the Cross. Then the priest or deacon announces that the Mass has ended.
