Finance Council Highlights

Note: The summary presented here reflects the yearend statements provided for our independent financial review. The final report from this review is still pending, and may result in minor adjustments to some values.

- As detailed in the table at right, St. Patrick's completed the 2021/2022 Fiscal Year (FY) in a net positive financial position of \$200,976.
- Key revenue factors for this outcome:
 - Although offertory was a bit under the budget goal, specific Donor Restricted contributions from you, our parishioners supplemented the offertory - bless you all for your continued generosity!
 - · Again thanks to your benevolence in the Returning God's Gifts program, we exceeded our goal and received a substantial rebate.
 - · We also received a very generous gift from our paving contractor, who donated half of the parking lot resurfacing expense last year.
 - · Finally, we received a sizeable insurance settlement for the window damage from the December wind storm, offsetting the repair expense.
- Key expense factors:
 - Actual personnel expenses were well under budget due to open positions including a Parochial Vicar.
 - · Actual worship and faith formation expenses significantly exceeded their budgeted amounts. Major unplanned expenses included grounds maintenance,

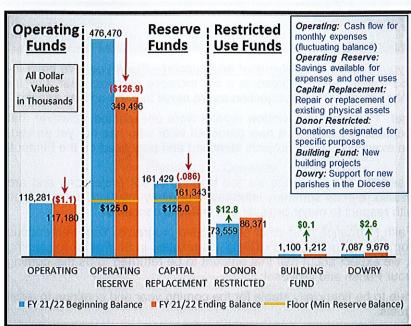

utilities, youth room remodeling, sound system upgrade, and parking lot resurfacing.

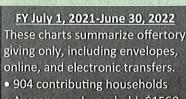

The business office has continued to apply the same internal processes and controls that have been recognized in prior years as thorough and professional. Summary of Cash Assets

- The chart at left reflects St. Pat's operating and reserve cash as of June 30, 2022.
- Operating Funds fluctuate each month as we receive income and pay for expenses, so the decrease in value shown does not represent a fixed deficit.
- Upgrades to the sound and video systems and landscaping work are primary contributors to the decreases in Re-
- No Funds were moved to Capital Replacement Reserve in this Fiscal Year.
- The increase in Donor Restricted Funds is due to continued donations and fewer ministry expenses this year.
- · Overall, thanks to the tremendous generosity of you the parishioners as well as our efficient and dedicated staff, we maintain a comfortable margin of Reserve Funds to safeguard against unforeseen expenses and to maintain the facilities at an acceptable level.

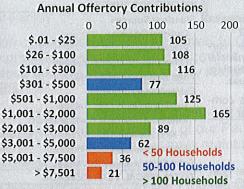
Tithing/Offertory Analysis, FY July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022



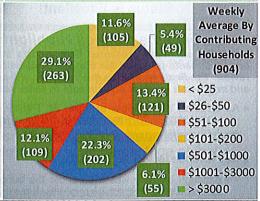

How Your Stewardship Gave Life to St. Pat's

- The diagram at right illustrates how your contributions were applied to Parish operating and administrative costs.
- Offertory is clearly a critical factor, covering staff payroll and benefits, commitments to the Diocese, and operating expenses.
- Miscellaneous income sources supplement cash reserves, and restricted donations fund specific ministries and Parish projects.
- Facilities expenditures make up the bulk of Operating Expenses, and include utilities, property insurance, grounds maintenance and other contracted services.

Fiscal Year Outlook: July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023

Indicated

- Our financial outlook remains positive due to <u>your continued involvement and support—thank you!</u> We have increased our offertory goal for this FY to \$1.553 million, which represents a 5% increase over last year. Our income for the first five months of this year is right on track with this projection as we move into the holiday season.
- Our net expenses thus far remain under budget. The sanctuary window repairs were unexpected, however that expense is offset by savings in personnel expenses, in particular a new parochial vicar who has not yet arrived. As reserve funds are available, we will continue executing facility projects identified and prioritized on the Finance Council's Capital Improvement Plan.
- The parish staff monitors revenue and expenses monthly, ensuring we are tracking to our projections and are aware of any variances. Your Finance Council also reviews summary information at every meeting, and provides Fr. Frank with advice and recommendations with respect to major projects and financial concerns.
- Also for this FY, we anticipate growth in our Faith Formation and other stewardship programs. Your tremendous generosity for the Diocesan Ministry Appeal (formerly Returning God's Gifts) has resulted in St. Patrick exceeding our goal to date by nearly \$40,000! From this, we expect about half that amount to be returned to us this coming spring—Bless you all for your stewardship to your Parish and Diocese!
- We remain confident that St. Patrick will continue to be financially stable for the coming year and continue to meet the needs of our faithful and our stewardship goals.
